Community Advisory Council - Community Update OPG Pickering and Darlington November 28, 2017

Activities - from Pickering and Darlington Nuclear

- Darlington Nuclear Open House October 17/18
- On Student Day, Friday, Oct. 17, 180 students from grades 9 to 11 visited from four different schools in Courtice and Bowmanville.
- They had the opportunity to visit with 37 vendors and exhibitors including post-secondary schools offering related programs, trade unions; companies involved in providing products/se rvices to the project and Scientists in Schools.
- 60 students attended the Trades Indigenous Careers fair on Friday afternoon.
 - On Saturday, Oct. 28, more than 2,100 community members visited the Darlington Energy Complex. Throughout the day, they had an opportunity to participate in reactor mock up tours and site bus tours, visit with vendors, view electric cars including a Tesla, virtual reality displays, simulator display of control panel, try on rubber suits and take selfies in front of the mock-up. This was the highest attendance to date for a one day open house.
- Onsite surveys were done to gather input for possible future events but initial feedback on the day was highly positive.

Pickering Community Information Session – Oct. 24 to 26

- Our annual information sessions were held at the Scarborough Pan Am Center (Oct. 24), the Pickering Recreation Centre (Oct. 25) and the Pickering Information Centre (Oct. 26) from 5:30 8:30 p.m. with a presentation and Q&A session at 6:30 from Randy Lockwood, SVP Pickering Nuclear and Kevin Lee and Heather Overton of the CNSC.
- The session provided OPG with an opportunity to talk about licence renewal activities and to answer community questions pertaining to safety and station operations.
- In addition, representatives from the DEMO, Durham Region and the City of Toronto were on hand to provide information and answer questions about their role in emergency planning and preparedness.
- 44 people total attended all three sessions.

OPG employees who will share their work experience, talents, and resources. Over 140 Grade 9 students visited our nuclear facilities.

Operation Clean Sweep

• On Nov. 11, over 50 volunteers from OPG, their friends and family participated in North American Young Generation in Nuclear (NAYGN) Durham's Fall 2017 Operation Clean Sweep. Despite the cold weather, the group helped a total of 23 seniors in the Durham region with yard work and had a great time doing it. The next clean up will be held in the spring.

Pickering ExUC - December 6/7

- Reminder: In December, OPG will conduct Exercise Unified Control, a large scale emergency exercise that will test the cooperation between participating organizations during a nuclear emergency and demonstrate the ability to take urgent and early actions to protect the public and surrounding communities in a nuclear emergency (however unlikely).
- The focus group reviewing communications products (including two Pickering CAC members) will take place on day two of the exercise, Dec. 7.
- On Tuesday, Nov. 14 OPG hosted a public launch of the exercise with guest speakers including Durham Region CAO Garry Cubitt, Pickering Councillor Kevin Ashe, and representatives from the CNSC, Office of the Fire Marshall and Emergency Management and OPG.
