Darlington Community Events

May 18 – Grade 12 students from Courtice Secondary School, visited the Orono Crown Lands to construct a shade shelter situated along the trail systems. This is one of the many partnership projects that OPG and Courtice Secondary school have completed throughout our 20-year education and environment partnership.

May 18 - Central Lake Ontario Conservation (CLOCA) hosted an interactive Turtle Conservation workshop at the Darlington Information Centre. This interactive community workshop for all ages, provided participants with the tools and resources to help protect local native turtle populations and their habitats. Guests had the opportunity to interact with baby turtles and take home a free turtle nesting structure.

May 27 - OPG in partnership with the Municipality of Clarington, hosted a Scout Pollinator Planting event in the Port of Newcastle. In efforts to stem the decline of monarch butterflies, honey bees and other pollinator species, a variety of native pollinator plants were planted by local Scouting groups along an identified monarch migration route. OPG has had a long term partnership with the local Scouting community, and look forward to continued future plantings.
