OPG'S 2015 TUESDAYS ON THE TRAIL PROGRAM BEGINS THIS WEEK

Toronto – Ontario Power Generation (OPG) is proud to announce the start of its 2015 Tuesdays on the Trail program. Children and their families are invited to take part in a series of FREE, fun and educational activities taking place Tuesdays this summer in Durham region. These activities are ideal for kids ages five to 12.

This year's activity lineup includes First Nations teachings, nature yoga, guided wildlife hikes, and much more. Kids can even spend a day as park rangers. Programming runs from July 7 to Aug. 25, and takes place at the Enniskillen Conservation Area in Clarington and Alex Robertson Park in Pickering. Pre-registration is required for events taking place in Clarington.

Tuesdays on the Trail is an annual program that has run for more than 10 years as part of OPG's commitment to environmental protection and stewardship. Since 2000, the company has sponsored dozens of community environmental initiatives and planted nearly six million trees and shrubs on 2,700 hectares of ecologically strategic land across Ontario.

"OPG has a strong commitment to environmental stewardship and to our host communities," says Ted Gruetzner, Vice President, Corporate Relations and Communications. "Through programs like Tuesdays on the Trail and OPG Biodiversity, we're hoping to inspire young Ontarians to preserve our natural landscape for generations to come."

In addition to OPG's hydroelectric and thermal generating stations, the company operates two nuclear facilities in Pickering and Darlington. Together they produce more than 6,600 megawatts of power. In total, 99.7 per cent of the power OPG produces is free of smog and greenhouse gas emissions.
