OPG JOINS NUCLEAR TRADE MISSION ONTARIO'S ENERGY MINISTER TO LEAD SOUTH KOREAN TRIP

Toronto – Ontario Power Generation (OPG) will be joining Ontario Energy Minister Bob Chiarelli and the Organization of Canadian Nuclear Industries on a nuclear power trade mission to South Korea from April 26 to May 2.

“This trip allows us the chance to bring our internationally recognized expertise to enhance these trade efforts between Ontario and South Korea’s nuclear industry,” said Pierre Tremblay, President of Canadian Nuclear Partners (CNP), a subsidiary of Ontario Power Generation. “We can further grow the global nuclear industry by sharing our nuclear expertise and innovation abroad.”

OPG is the largest nuclear company in Canada. We own twenty nuclear reactors in Ontario, and operate Darlington and Pickering nuclear stations. We are the province’s clean energy provider with 99.7 per cent of our generation smog and greenhouse gas emissions-free. OPG has more than 17,000 megawatts of generating capacity including 65 hydroelectric stations.
