Performance Report for Pickering Nuclear

Performance Update

As part of our commitment to keep you informed, this report tracks performance for Ontario Power Generation's Pickering Nuclear in the areas of safety, operational and environmental performance and significant accomplishments during the first quarter of 2014.



Electricity Production - (the electrical energy generated, minus station needs)

OPG's nuclear electricity generation for Q1 of 2014 totalled 11.6 terawatt hours (TWh) compared to 11.6 TWh in 2013 in the same quarter. In Q1, Pickering Nuclear produced 4.3 TWh of electricity, meeting 11 per cent of Ontario's electricity needs.



Reliability - Unit Capability Factor

Compared to Q1 in 2013, Pickering's unit capability factor for Q1 2014 was lower (66.57) primarily as a result of an increase in the number of days the station was shut down for maintenance outages.



Environment - Performance Index

During Q1 2014, Pickering Nuclear did not record any major or moderate spills to the environment.

Accident Severity Rate


The Accident Severity Rate (ASR) measures the number of lost days due to employee injuries per 200,000 hours worked. In Q1 2014, Pickering Nuclear recorded 24 days lost following an injury suffered by an employee who fractured their ankle while at work.



Employee All Injury Rate

The All Injury Rate (AIR) measures the number of workplace injuries per 200,000 hours worked. In Q1 2014, Pickering Nuclear recorded zero injuries per 200,000 hours worked which is better than the Canadian Electricity Association top quartile industry performance.







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About OPG's Nuclear Generating Stations

Ontario Power Generation owns and operates the Pickering and Darlington Nuclear Generating Stations. The two stations have a combined generating capacity of about 6,600 megawatts. Accounting for almost 11 per cent of the electricity generated in Ontario in Q1, OPG's 10 nuclear units generated 11.6 terawatt hours.
